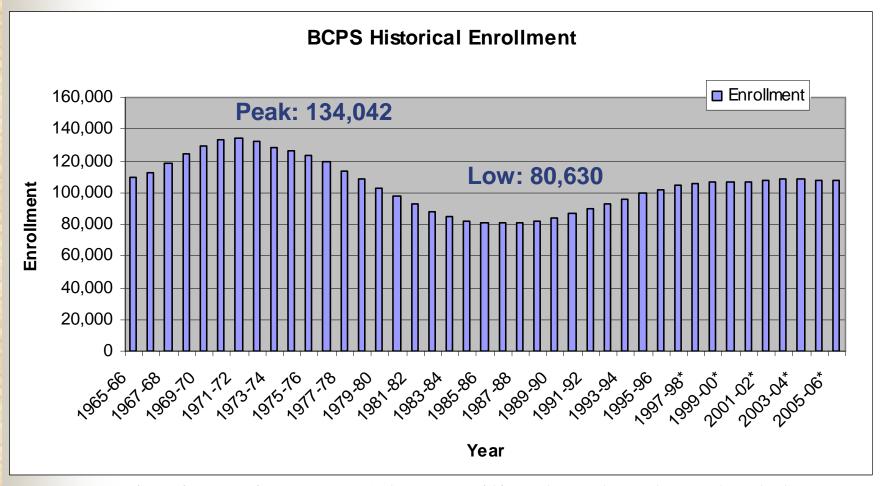

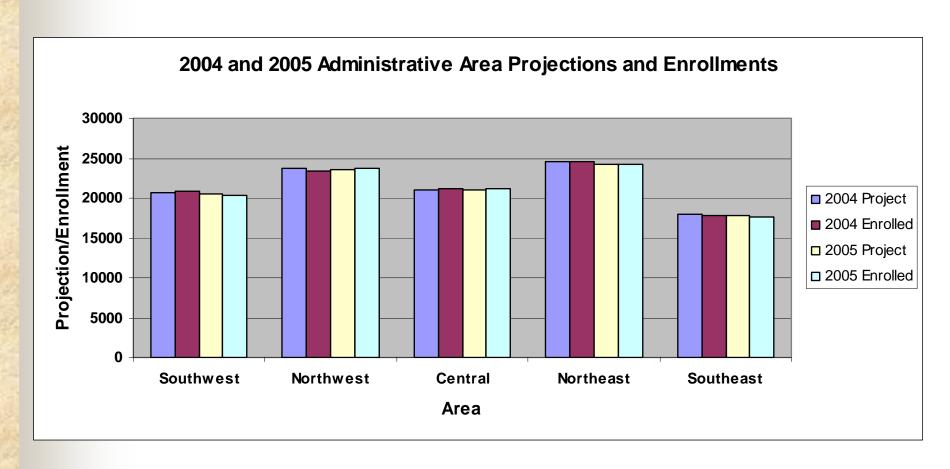

### ENROLLMENTS AND PROJECTIONS BY ADMINISTRATIVE AREA

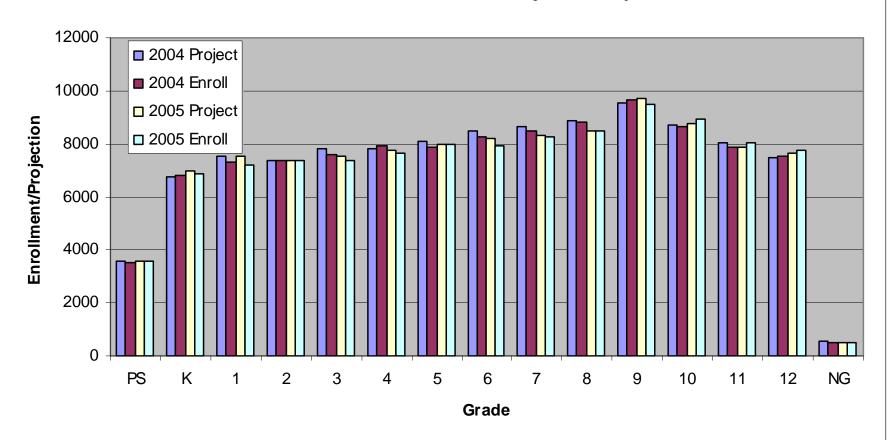

### FACTORS THAT INFLUENCE ENROLLMENT

- Births
- Transition to Full-Day Kindergarten
- Demographic trends: in-migration, out-migration, and mobility
- Parent and student decision (e.g., magnet programs, special permission transfers, home schooling, private/parochial schools)
- Residential development, community revitalization, housing market, housing trends
- Program changes
- Law and policy (e.g., House Bill 1230, Informal Kinship Bill, Title I Transfers, *Bridge to Excellence*, *No Child Left Behind*)
- Labor changes and economy

### **SUMMARY**

- The countywide projection accuracy is within the 1% goal of *Blueprint For Progress* Performance Indicator 8.5
- The stabilizing of BCPS enrollments is countywide, and not attributable to a single factor
- The leveling of enrollments was an anticipated trend

### **NEXT STEPS**

- The Office of Strategic Planning will meet with each Area Assistant Superintendent to discuss enrollments, projection, capacity, and proposed solutions to situations of overcrowding/underutilization.
- The Office of Strategic Planning will use Geographic Information System (GIS) to analyze student population distribution, demographics, and capacity.
- Develop explanations for schools that were significantly higher or lower than projection (+/- 40 students or 10% off projection). As of September 30, 2005, 29 schools met this criteria.
- New enrollment projections for 2006 2015 will be developed in November/December.
- Projections for schools involved in boundary changes (e.g. Windsor Mill MS) will be updated after boundaries are approved.
