What is Common Core? It came from the states. Forty-five states agreed to hold themselves to these standards. It will take effect during the 2013-2014 school year. Why? There were varying academic standards from state to state, student mobility and to compete globally. It was to create fewer, clearer and higher standards and to increase rigor along with critical thinking. BCPS was well ahead of things because we already had the Blueprint for Progress.

English/ Reading Language Arts and Math – There are 10 for each of the four areas. K-8 is by Grade and 9-10 and 11-12 for high school.

Grade	Literary Text	Informational Text
4	50%	50%
8	45%	55%
12	30%	70%

Mathematics – State Department of Education is putting together the curriculum based on the standards. Change in content by grade level. Defines clearly what should be able to be done by a student K-12. Grades K-8 there are grade by grade standards organized by domain. Grade 9-12 for high schools they are organized by conceptual categories.

Mastery based content:

K-5 numbers, geometry & number sense

6-8 Fractions, algebra, functions, statistics & probability

There are two pathways- grades 6, 7 & 8 or accelerated grade 6 then Algebra I.

Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College & Careers (PARCC) What is not covered?

How teachers should teach? All skills that should be covered Advanced/ GT work Intervention & support for above and below grade level

ELL & special education

All college and career readiness skills

Where does STEM fit?

STEM is mentioned but there are no Common Core Standards for STEM in Maryland

Baltimore County is working on connecting them to STEM

#### **Transition Plan**

Last year a gap analysis was completed to find gaps.

2011-2012 we are using the current curriculum. Students will take the MSA and HSA tests. We are focusing on understanding six RELA, six Math and six STEM standards. Training is occurring in all schools.

2012-2013 year we will begin the curriculum transition. Students are still taking MSA and HSA.

2013-2014 year we will continue the curriculum transition. Students are still taking MSA and HSA as well as PARCC field testing.

2014-2015 year we will be using the Common Core State Curriculum and giving the PARCC baseline testing.

Current kindergarten students will know only the Common Core.
