52.58% of HS students students took Career and Technical Education courses; largest in the state.

More than **1,200 BCPS students take college courses at CCBC.** In 2020-21, **14** earned both high school diploma and associate's degree.

The BCPS AVID Class of 2022 was the largest graduating class ever, with over **600 graduating AVID Scholars** who earned a combined total of more than **\$36 million in scholarship and grant offers.**

In Spring of 2022, **5,736 students took 10,991 AP Exams.** 67% of students scored a 3 or higher, earning them college credit as high school students.
