Vice Chair Cheryl Pasteur announces resignation from Board of Education

TOWSON – Cheryl Pasteur, vice chair of the Board of Education of Baltimore County, has announced her resignation from the Board of Education effective immediately.

Pasteur, who represents District 2 and was elected to the Board in 2018, recently announced her candidacy for the House of Delegates seat in District 11A. State law prohibits an individual from serving on the Board of Education while pursuing an elected or appointed office for a political party or the local, state, or federal government.

“I am thankful for my time on the Board of Education and the opportunity to serve the students and staff of BCPS,” said Pasteur. “I have grown tremendously in this role, and I look forward to continuing my work and advocacy on behalf of the children of Baltimore County.”

Board Chair Julie Henn thanked Pasteur for her service and praised her tireless advocacy and commitment to Team BCPS.
