Winners announced in 2022 BCPS Black History Month Writing Contest

Top awards earned by students from Logan and Riderwood elementary schools, Arbutus Middle School, and Catonsville High School

Towson, MD – Top honors in the 2022 BCPS Black History Month Writing contest have been earned by students from Logan and Riderwood elementary schools, Arbutus Middle School, and Catonsville High School.

The contest, sponsored by the BCPS Offices of English Language Arts and Social Studies, challenged students in Kindergarten through Grade 12 to craft entries inspired by a Black activist, artist, athlete, author, musician, scientist, or other public figure.

The top entries included an essay about Misty Copeland (the first Black woman to be named a principal dancer for American Ballet Theatre); poems about Amanda Gorman (the first National Youth Poet Laureate); Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (iconic civil rights leader); and Elijah Anderson (a leading conductor on the Underground Railroad.)
